Topic : ‘Oncoplastic Surgery for Breast Cancer: Experience over Recent One Decade’

Summary : Surgical treatment of breast cancer has evolved considerably over the years, and Breast Conservation Surgery (BCS) is the current standard of care for early breast cancer. BCS provides outcomes equivalent to the more radical surgical approach i.e. mastectomy. BCS involves excision of the breast tumour with wide margins, histopathological assessment of margins to ensure there isn't any residual cancerous tissue, and irradiating the remnant breast. This is done, while also maintaining the breast shape, contour and symmetry.

Oncoplastic breast surgery (OBS) is a relatively newer strategy which combines best surgical oncology for breast conservation, and plastic – reconstructive techniques simultaneously, to achieve the twin goals of

a) Robust oncological cure of breast tumor, and b) Good cosmetic outcome. A myriad of OBS techniques are in use, which range from relatively simpler Level -I to more complex Level-II procedures. Based on size and location of tumor within the breast, breast –tumor size ratio, and patient's body habitus, an appropriate OBS technique is chosen for an individual case.

b) The Department of Endocrine and Breast Surgery has been practicing oncoplastic breast surgery over past two decades. We are aided in this pursuit by an active collaboration with departments of Radio-therapy, Pathology, Radiology, and Plastic surgery. In this CGR presentation, we will present some illustrative OBS cases, and a brief audit of our experience with these procedures accumulated over last one decade.
